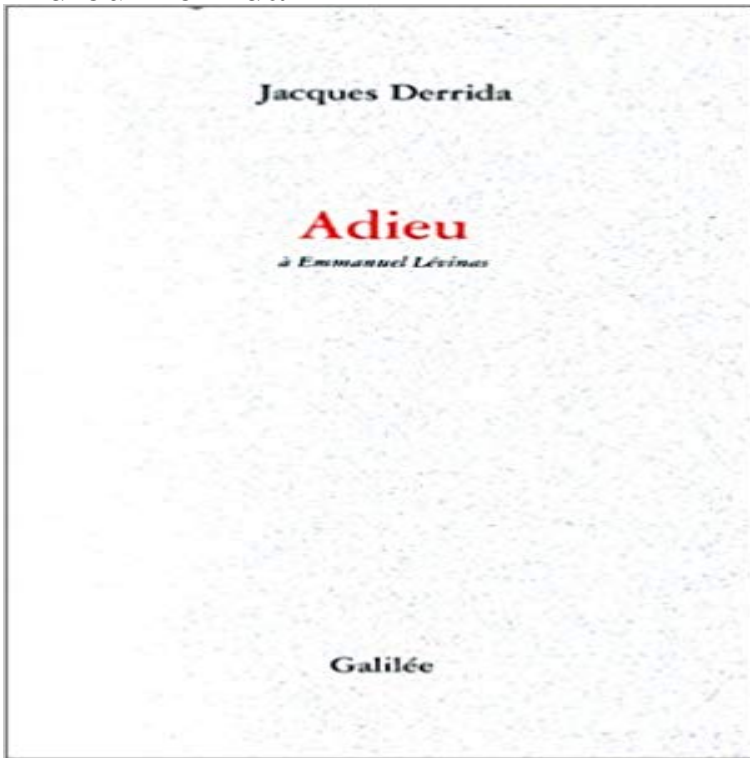


Adieu Derrida
